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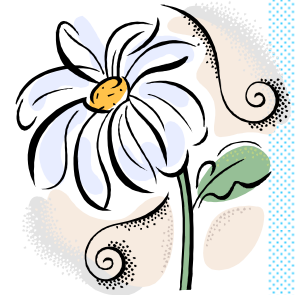

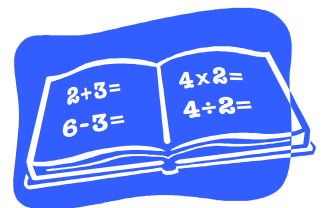
Play Group

Friday May 3 : Steph & Ivan were very busy in the veggie gardens and did a great job planting out seedlings that were donated to us. Our hot house is filled with pots of lettuce and Asian greens. Many thanks to Andrew Brown for donation of happy little seedlings; lettuce, garlic, broadbeans, & silverbeet all snug in their grow pots. We have also planted some very special silverbeet that is pale green and very tasty.

Last Friday we sowed snow pea, carrot & parsnip seeds. We spread two bags of magic mulch/manure from Andrew's goats. Andrew donated some different varieties of cauliflower, broccoli & cabbage. He also gave us mystery tomato plants to experiment with under plastic over the next few months.

Thanks to the students rostered to water our green house seedlings and seed beds until our next session on Thursday - let's hope we get some gentle rain this week for our garden beds.
