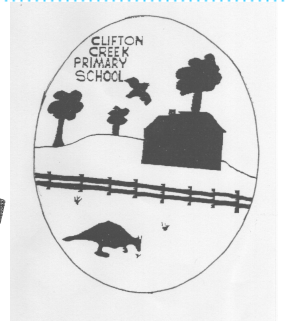

As I look back over this term, the children have worked hard and made progress in maths and literacy.

We have now focussed on all the vowel spelling sounds, and in maths have learnt about time, money and shape as well as continuing to consolidate our skip counting and work with the four processes.

The children's writing is showing more structure and "making sense" and they are better at editing their own work. There has been progress in everyone's reading, not necessarily by moving a lot of levels, but in having greater understanding of what is being read.

Another focus has been social skill and resilience development, as the children can tend to jump to conclusions or blow things out of proportion. Being able to compromise, listen and understand other perspectives is tricky, but we are working on it!

This Friday we have our Footy Day which will be great fun, and the big excitement is our Camp which is the Thursday and Friday of the first week back next term.

The tree planting will take place tomorrow, Wednesday 17th September, from 1.45-3.15pm. Students will be transported in teachers' cars to and from the property.

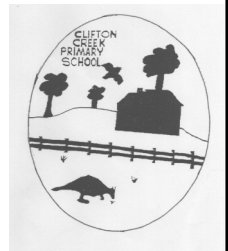
