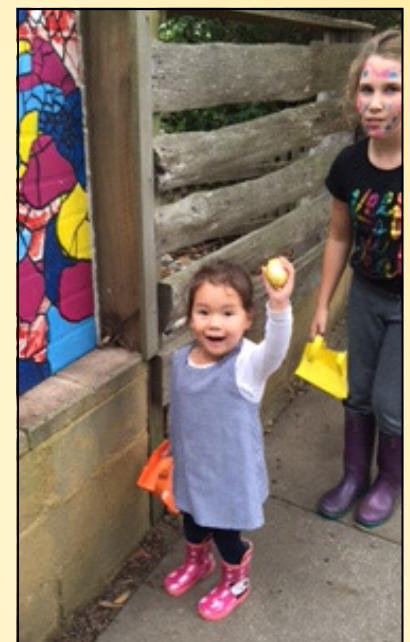
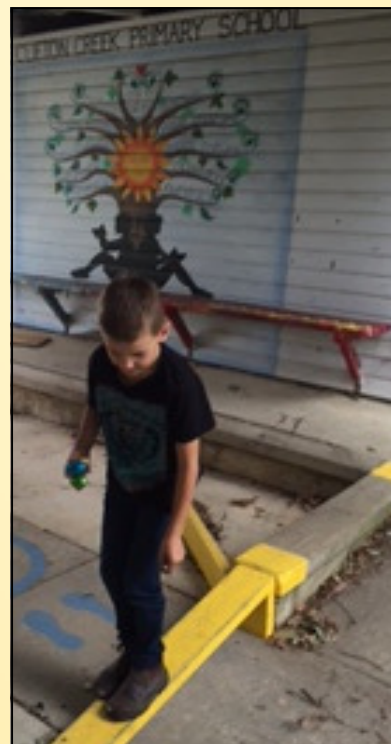
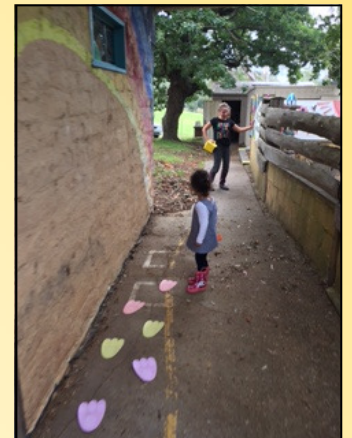
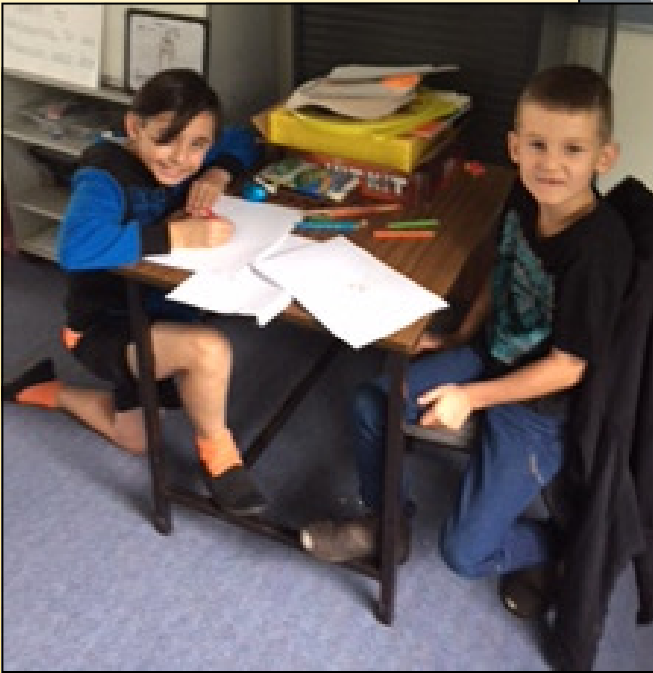
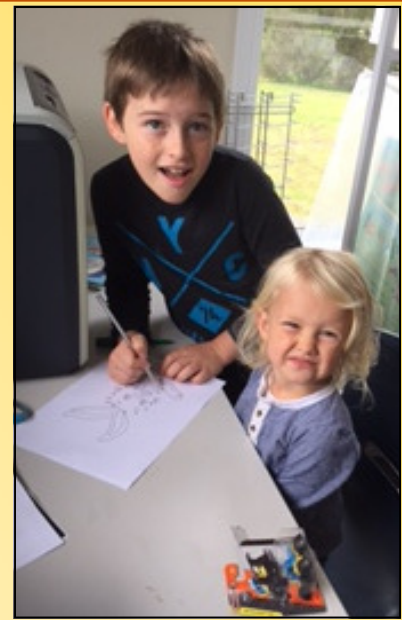
There will be no Friday Fang or Tuckshop this week. These services will begin next week. An Autumn Menu will be in our next newsletter.

LUNCHBOX IDEAS

Pick and mix one tasty option from each of the food groups below to create a healthy lunchbox every day:

Fruit (e.g. fresh, frozen, pureed and canned in natural juice)

Vegetables, legumes and beans

Offer different types and colours

Milk, yoghurt, cheese and alternatives (e.g. soy, rice, oat and almond based products with at least 100mg of calcium per 100mL/g)

Reduced fat options are best.

Lean meats and poultry, fish, eggs, tofu, nuts* and seeds, and legumes/beans

If your school has a nut-free policy, peanut butter and other nuts should not be included in your child's lunchbox.

Grain (cereal) foods (e.g. breads, cereals, rice, pasta, noodles, polenta, couscous, oats, quinoa and barley)

Wholegrain and/or high fibre varieties are best.

Plain water (e.g. tap, spring, mineral, soda and sparkling)

Offer water as the drink of choice.
